ORDER

1. General Rule. Unless otherwise specifically authorized by the United States Marshal, no person (including any local, state or federal law enforcement officer or agent), other than the United States Marshal, a Deputy United States Marshal, a Court Security Officer, or a Federal Protective Service Officer, shall carry any weapon in the Warren B. Rudman U. S. Courthouse and the James C. Cleveland Federal Building (hereinafter referred to collectively as "federal facility").


2. Depositing of Weapons. Except as otherwise provided herein or unless otherwise specifically authorized by the United States Marshal, law enforcement officers or agents shall deposit any firearm with the United States Marshals Service immediately upon entering the federal facility.

3. Exhibits. Any person bringing any weapon into the federal facility that is intended to be introduced as an exhibit shall take the weapon to the United States Marshals Service immediately upon entering the federal facility. No weapon may be taken into a courtroom unless it is first presented to the United States Marshals Service for a safety check and the Marshal or a Deputy Marshal reports to the clerk that the check has been completed and the

weapon is secured. This could include the installation of a lock or other device to make the weapon inoperable. If securing a weapon in this manner has a potential to raise evidentiary issues at trial, upon application to the presiding judge, for good cause, the court may upon written order make exceptions to this policy.

The United States Marshal has the responsibility of administering and enforcing this policy through his deputies and the Court Security Officers.
