

DAVID L. NIXON was born in Concord, Massachusetts. He graduated with Honors from Wesleyan University in 1953 as President of his class and Football Co-captain. After volunteer service in the U. S. Army, he earned his law degree from the University of Michigan Law School in 1958, where he also served as President of his class, and was a member of the Barristers Honor Society. He served the Town of New Boston as Town Moderator and Town Counsel for twenty-seven years. He also served as a New Hampshire State Representative from 1969-1970, was named Outstanding First Year Legislator in 1969, and was elected President of the New Hampshire State Senate in 1973-74, having served as Chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee in 1971-72. He was also elected a Delegate to the 1984 New Hampshire Constitutional Convention. He has served as a Trustee of Colby-Sawyer College, and as President of the New Hampshire Bar Association, the Manchester Bar Association, and was the first President of the New England Bar Association. He is a member of the Association Of Trial Lawyers of America, The Inner Circle Of Advocates, The Million Dollar Advocates Forum, has served as the President of the International Society Of Barristers, as Chair of the New Hampshire Bar Association Mediation Committee, and as a founding Director and Secretary of the Joe Yukica/New Hampshire Chapter, National Football Foundation And Hall Of Fame, which awarded him its Distinguished Citizen Award in 2000.

A practicing trial lawyer since 1958, Mr. Nixon has been awarded the New Hampshire Bar Association's Distinguished Service Award, the New Hampshire Trial Lawyers' Association Award as Trial Lawyer Of The Decade, the New Hampshire Bar Association's Award For Outstanding Professionalism, The New Hampshire Bar Foundation's highest award, as an Honorary Fellow; and has been voted the Manchester Bar Association "Lawyer of the Year". He also has been a member of the New Hampshire Judicial Council, and the New Hampshire Court Accreditation Commission, appointed to both by the New Hampshire Supreme Court. Admitted to practice before the New Hampshire Supreme Court, the United States District Court For New Hampshire, the United States Circuit Court Of Appeals, and the United States Supreme Court, Mr. Nixon has been certified by the National Board Of Trial Advocacy as a Civil Trial Advocate. He is a Life Member of the American Legion and the Disabled American Veterans, has served as a Judge Advocate and Commander of Sweeney Post No. 2, American Legion in Manchester, and has also served as

Scholarship Chair of the Hillsborough County Law Enforcement Association. He also is a volunteer "DOVE Attorney", representing, pro bono, abused women and children.

Mr. Nixon's trial experience includes personal injury matters of all kinds, product-defect cases, and also business litigation, employee rights cases, defamation claims, and medical negligence matters.
