## ORDER EXTENDING DEADLINES IN PRIOR STANDING ORDERS

**ADM-1 ORDER 20-17** 

## ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

In support of this order, the court adopts and incorporates the findings made in Standing Order ADM-1, Order 20-5: Court Operations Under the Exigent Circumstances Created by COVID-19. In addition to those findings, the court further finds that since the first announced case in New Hampshire on March 2, 2020, the state has reported 3,160 confirmed cases of COVID-19. So far, 142 deaths have been attributed to the disease in this state. Further, in New Hampshire approximately 3,325 people are being monitored for signs of COVID-19 infection, over 37,267 people have been tested, and community-based transmission has been confirmed. Nationally, the number of confirmed cases has grown to over 1,408,745 with 83,449 cases resulting in death.

Given the continued escalation of the COVID-19 pandemic, the court extends the following deadlines:

- 1. All deadlines contained in ADM-1, 20-5, which were extended to June 1, 2020, are further extended to July 1, 2020.
- 2. For all district court civil and criminal hearings scheduled before July 1, 2020, the presiding judge has the discretion to continue and/or reschedule those hearings to occur by teleconference, videoconference, or in-court hearing at the Rudman Courthouse.
- 3. The procedural orders for in-court hearings (ADM-1, 20-6) and videoconference and telephonic hearings (ADM-1, 20-7) are extended to July 1, 2020.

This order shall take effect immediately. Except as stated herein, all existing Standing Orders remain in full force and effect.
