ORDER

Due to the recent outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), and to protect public health and safety, the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire issues the following order:

Effective immediately, the following people shall not enter the Rudman Courthouse or Cleveland Federal Building:

- Persons who have traveled in the last 14 days to an area with a Level 3 Travel Health Notice issued by the Centers of Disease Control (updated list available at <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/after-travel-precautions.html>)
- Persons who reside with, or have had close contact with, someone who has traveled to one of those countries within the last fourteen days.
- Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital or health agency.
- Persons who have been diagnosed with, or have had contact with, anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last fourteen days.
- Persons who have been on a cruise ship within the last 14 days.


Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols will be denied entry by court security officers.

These access restrictions have been imposed pursuant to 41 C.F.R. § 102-74.375(b).

This order supersedes the court's order on Restricted Access to Rudman Courthouse and Cleveland Federal Building, ADM-1, 20-2, dated March 10, 2020, and takes effect immediately.
