RESTRICTED PUBLIC ACCESS TO RUDMAN COURTHOUSE AND CLEVELAND FEDERAL BUILDING

ADM-1 ORDER 21-13

<u>ORDER</u>

Due to the continuing public health and safety issues resulting from Coronavirus Disease 2019 and SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes the disease)—which we refer to simply as "COVID-19"—and consistent with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other public health authorities, the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire issues the following order restricting public access.

Effective immediately, the following people shall not enter the Rudman Courthouse or the Cleveland Federal Building:

- Persons who will not wear a mask or face covering that covers their noses and mouths and stay at least 6 feet from others. The court will provide a mask/face covering for those seeking entry who do not have their own covering.
- Persons who have a temperature of greater than 100.4.
- Persons experiencing any of the following symptoms within the past 10 days:

-Chills
-Cough (unless due to allergies or asthma)
-Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing (unless due to allergies or asthma)
-Fatigue
-Headache (that is unusual for you)
-Loss of taste/smell
-Sore throat
-Congestion or runny nose
-Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
-Muscle or body aches

-Other symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the CDC in the future

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 and experienced symptoms, you may not enter the courthouse until:
 - at least 14 days have passed since you first experienced symptoms, AND
 - you have been symptom-free for at least 3 days.
- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 but did not have symptoms, you may not enter the courthouse until:
 - at least 14 days have passed since you tested positive.
- If you have had contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19, you may not enter the courthouse:
 - o until at least 14 days have passed since the contact occurred, AND
 - o during those 14 days, you have not developed any symptoms, <u>OR</u>
 - you are fully vaccinated (14 days since final dose) or recovered from COVID-19 within the past 90 days.
- Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital or health agency within the past 14 days.
- If you have traveled internationally or on a cruise ship in the past 14 days, you may not enter the courthouse unless:
 - you tested negative (using a molecular or PCR-based test) 7 days after return to the continental United States and you remain symptom-free with no fever, OR
 - you recovered from COVID-19 within the past 3 months, OR
 - you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and more than 14 days have passed since you received the final dose of your vaccine.

For contact tracing purposes, people entering the Rudman Courthouse will be asked to identify themselves and provide contact information by court security officers or court staff.

Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols, or who decline to identify themselves upon request, will be denied entry or asked to vacate the courthouse by court security officers.

These access restrictions have been imposed pursuant to 41 C.F.R. § 102-74.375(b).

This order supersedes the court's order on Restricted Access to Rudman Courthouse and Cleveland Federal Building, ADM-1, 20-33, dated November 16, 2020, and takes effect immediately.
