Cherkaoui v. City of Quincy

December 4, 2017

Civil Rights, Labor & Employment Law

(United States First Circuit) - Affirming the district court's grant of summary judgment to the City of Quincy, sued by a former employee alleging discrimination, retaliation, and constructive discharge, because the record reflected that the employer's actions related to repeated tardiness and absenteeism rather than discrimination.

In Re Irving Tanning Company

December 4, 2017

Bankruptcy Law, Corporation & Enterprise Law, Corp. Governance

(United States First Circuit) - Affirming bankruptcy court and district court rulings that a transaction involving the debt-financed purchase of a family owned leather manufacturer was not a fraudulent conveyance and did not amount to a violation of the fiduciary duties of the company's directors because the factual determinations were not clearly erroneous and supported the court's conclusions.

Thomas G. Gallagher, Inc. v. OSHA

December 4, 2017

Labor & Employment Law, Administrative Law

(United States First Circuit) - Denying the petition for review in the case of a fine levied against a Massachusetts employer imposed by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration for workplace health and safety violations, holding that the court properly established the employer's constructive knowledge of the dangerous conditions and ruling that the company failed to exercise reasonable diligence.

US v. Marte De La Cruz

December 4, 2017

Immigration Law, Criminal Law & Procedure

(United States First Circuit) - Dismissing the appeal following a man's plea of guilt to attempted illegal reentry to the United States following removal because he had waived his right to appeal the finding that his prior conviction was an aggravated felony or crime of violence as part of his plea agreement.

Evans v. US

December 4, 2017

Administrative Law, Environmental Law, Government Law

(United States First Circuit) - Affirming the dismissal of a case in which a man complained about the destruction of his shade trees by the government, seeking to contain a beetle infestation, because the act qualified for sovereign immunity under the discretionary function exception.
